

EXECUTIVE REPORT TO THE CONGREGATION – FEBRUARY 20,2022

I'm Linda MacDonald. It is my pleasure and privilege to deliver the report from the Executive Committee this morning. Here are some of the highlights from the most recent business meeting on Tuesday, February 15, 2022.

Without doubt, one of the most positive and encouraging highlights of the meeting was the Executive's unanimous decision to return to in-person gatherings, beginning March 1, as New Brunswick returns to Level 1 of the recovery from COVID. Details of this decision may be found in Rev. Lloyd's most recent musings. In brief, this decision comes just in time for the celebration of the Ash Wednesday service on March 2.

The SUC choir's project to dedicate a wall hanging in memory of Karen Sears on Easter Sunday was approved. This memorial to Karen is handcrafted by Janet Moses.

Task Group #2: SUC Future Group continues to work out details for reaching out to the community to acquire potential guest tenants to rent space in SUC .

In addition to the annual Pie Day, another potential fundraiser has been proposed by Chrystal Schipper-Everill – a virtual auction. This would most likely be done the week before Easter. Details to follow.

Future projects for spring in relation to the maintenance of the building and property include: 1) an assessment of the condition of the roof and an updated quote for any needed repairs; 2) an assessment of any damage to the sign and headstones in the cemetery from the dumping of snow in that area.
